Objectives

After attending this WVAO-HNS continuing medical education conference, participants should have a better understanding and working knowledge of the following issues and how they relate to improved patient outcomes:

- Review common genetic and non-genetic etiologies of congenital hearing loss and common congenital syndromes associated with hearing loss
